

It's hard to believe that we are more than halfway through the year already! Are you meeting your fundraising goals? Have you tried anything new? Did you meet or talk to any participants at your event that would make a good Mason and a good Shriner? Throughout our travels and interactions with other shrine centers, too often we don't hear yes to these questions. Instead it's: our circus is no longer profitable. We don't want the potential risk of a failed sportsman's raffle. We don't have the manpower to put on a large event. I feel like many times when we think of fundraising we tend to want a home run. "We are going to have this one event and we are good for the year!" I'm not saying that swinging for the fence isn't the right thing to do. But if you're concerned about risking capital and doing the same event isn't netting the same returns. Then you need to try smaller fundraising events. Events that takes little to no capital investment. Require 2 – 5 meetings to plan, are completed in 1 day and require 6 -20 Shriners and ladies to facilitate.

If your fundraising chairman and Divan have doubts or want to learn new ideas on fundraising. Then you need to participate in SCAFRA's fall seminar. By the end of the session you will have the knowledge and the confidence to put on an Ice Fishing Tournament in July. Don't believe me, then come to SFA and we will introduce you to 2 Shrine Centers that have. See you in October.

A Message From Third Vice President


Greetings from Fargo,

As of this writing, I'm on my temple's annual fishing trip to the Lake of the Woods. It is about a 4 hour bus trip from El Zagal and to fill in the time we usually do some raffles on the bus to raise some money for our Transportation Fund. Usually we do a few 50/50 raffles where the winner gets half the money and the other half goes to the Transportation Fund. There are normally 35 to 40 guys on the bus and this will bring in around \$300. A short little fundraiser but it brought in \$700 for our fund in a little over a ½ hour. Just a little idea I thought I would share.

2019 Imperial Session, Nashville Tennessee

SFA 3rd Vice President attends Imperial



I recently had the pleasure of attending the Imperial Session in Nashville as a representative of the Shrine Fundraising Association along with this year's Association President, Jim Van De Hey. Our reason for going to Nashville was to staff an information booth about the Association as well as doing a few seminars on different aspects of fundraising. The purpose for this, was to meet and interact with Shriners from throughout Shrinedom to raise awareness of our Association and try to get them to become members.

One of my major reasons for running to become an officer of SFA was because this organization has greatly benefited my Temple. El Zagal was at risk of coming to an end because of declining membership. Once elected, I found myself in the company of 4 other elected officers who shared

my passion for seeing this association, not only survive, but to thrive. To that end, we put together a strategy of increasing the ability of SFA to better serve our members by providing more knowledge and information while increasing the ease of obtaining that through our quarterly publication, our web site as well as our annual seminars. In addition, in order to increase awareness of SFA and to gain memberships, we sent our officers to regional association meetings, the Oriental Guide/Assistant Rabban School in Tampa and the Imperial Session. These efforts have been quite successful, as we are on track to more than double our membership from a year ago.

So that is how I came to be manning an SFA booth in Nashville at the Imperial Marketplace. Over the course of 5 days, Jim and I spoke to hundreds of Potentates, Divan Members and Nobles at large. While we came to showcase the knowledge and information on fundraising that SFA offers its members, there was something else at play here. At the start, most of our visits were with Tem-

ples that were doing OK but were seeking to find ways to improve or increase their fundraisers. But slowly, there came to be more and more Temples coming up and telling us stories that were nothing short of heartbreaking. We learned of Shrine Temples that consisted of a rented office with a desk, a phone, a computer and a printer. Temples where the Divan had to rent a conference room in a hotel once a month, just so they had a place to meet. Tales of internal strife, where it seemed that there were Shriners who would rather see their Temple shut its doors rather than have things not go their way. These Temples were not coming to us just for knowledge or information, they were pleading for help to save their Temples. After a while, it got to the point where we almost began to feel a little bit like medics on a battlefield.

Overall, it was an amazing experience. I got to reconnect with some old friends, meet some new ones and I got to see what a wonderful City Nashville is. But most importantly, I came away more than a little humbled, but with a sense of increased devotion to the task that now lies before us. That as important as I once felt that SFA must not come to an end, I feel that it is even more important that we must be there to help those Shriners fighting to keep their Temples from coming to an end.



Future for Zuhrah Revenue

For years our shrine temple relied upon a large circus within the city of Minneapolis to generate revenue for general operation. The circus took place over four days. There was a tradition for our Nobility to support and work during the performances. The circus worked great. It was fun to work at and children were our main audience. Most importantly, it made enough money so there was no need for other fundraisers. Times have now changed and for various reasons this annual means of income will need to be replaced.

Leadership will have to find new means for revenue that the Nobility can support. As fiduciary stewards we decided to pursue multiple low risk fundraisers instead of larger more risky fundraisers such as a concert or monster truck show. Members rallied to sell onions and even a new Festival of Trees Fundraiser was successful. However, the revenue did not equal the standard amount raised from past circuses. An increase in dues would not be supported to make up the difference. There was now a need for someone from outside of our Divan to impress upon members other options for generating funds.

On Tuesday Feb 26th, 2019 President Jim Van De Hey of Shrine Fundraising Association made a presentation to our Club/Unit Leadership. He impressed upon the members the serious need of having a fundraising plan. This article is written four months after his visit. I would like to report on the observed results.

There are two significant changes in temple operations to mention. First, we now have a working fundraising temple committee that has meetings, minutes taken and discussion. Second, we are trying a temple fish fry fundraiser. It has a strong committee and we are planning for a fall dinner. Who in Minnesota doesn't love a fish fry?

Shriners are fundraising machines! It seems once members change their mindset from an annual circus to other options, financial stability will once again return.

Recommended By-laws Change

Current By-Laws

§ 5.1 Annual Meetings

The annual meeting of SFA shall be held during each year at a date and place selected by the members at a previous meeting and approved by the Imperial Officer who, if tradition is followed, will be Imperial Potentate in the year of the annual meeting. At the annual meeting, appropriate seminars, lectures and activities shall be scheduled by the directors which will enhance the purposes of SFA.

Proposed Amendment

§ 5.1 Annual Meetings

The Annual Meeting of SFA shall be held at the time and/or place determined by the Representatives at the Business Session held not fewer than Two (2) years prior to the date selected. The time and/or place shall be first recommended by the Executive Committee to the Convention Committee, which shall make a final recommendation to the Representatives for approval. The Business Session and the Ceremonial Session shall be held on the same weekend by the recommendation of the Executive Committee and Convention Committee and the approval of the Representatives at such Business Session.
